2022 SYDNEY ROYAL EASTER SHOW

This annual event is run by the **Royal Agricultural Society of NSW (RAS)**, a not-for-profit organisation that promotes and rewards agricultural excellence.

First held in 1823, the Sydney Royal Easter Show is Australia's largest annual ticketed event, attracting over 850,000 attendees on average. Revenue generated by the Show allows the RAS to invest in agricultural programs, competitions, education, youth, and rural NSW. In total, the RAS invests almost \$9 million annually in these activities, which are designed to promote agricultural excellence and keep our rural communities strong.

The Show is a celebration of Australian culture, from our rural traditions to our modern lifestyles, providing unique experiences for everyone. Every Easter, the country and city come together at Sydney Showground, Sydney Olympic Park, for 12 days of agricultural competitions, animal experiences, live entertainment, carnival fun, shopping and much more.

This year is a very special celebration, as the RAS celebrates 200 years since its inception. Historical facts, memorabilia, and references to early

Show traditions and entertainment can be found throughout the grounds this year, commemorating the rich history of the RAS and celebrating the very best of the Show over the years.

It began in 1822, in the early days of European settlement. The emphasis at that time was on agriculture and food provision for the new colony. The European settlers were struggling to adapt to the new environment and the problems they were facing with crops and farming. And so a group of interested agriculturalists met on 5 July 1822 and formed the Agricultural Society of NSW.

The following year the Society held a Show, with livestock and produce categories. It was an opportunity to educate and inform the people of the colony, and to come together to transact business and exchange ideas. Competitions were held, prizes were offered, and judging took place in front of the public.

MEDIA ACCESS TO THE SHOW

This year our accreditation system is completely digital, which means once you have completed your accreditation pass you can either add it to your 'phone wallet', take a screenshot to present at the gate or you can be emailed a PDF to print off and bring to the Show.

MEDIA ACCESS TO VENUES

All requests for access to GIANTS Stadium must be directed through the Media Centre. All media on the stadium grounds must wear a white coat (provided by the Media Centre) and broad-brimmed hat (provided by the individual). Under no circumstances are media allowed to enter GIANTS Stadium during a Grand Parade or the evening entertainment program.

All requests for access to Schmidt Arena, MasterChef Woodchop Stadium and Little Big Top Amphitheatre must be directed to the Media Centre.

ACCESS FOR TV CREWS

TV crews requiring onsite vehicle access for live-crosses and filming must advise the Media Centre, **at least 2 hours** in advance where possible, every time they wish to enter Sydney Showground. TV crews arriving at the Showground unannounced will not be admitted by Security. Crew cars and link trucks **ONLY** will be provided with on-site parking.

MEDIA PARKING

A limited number of media parking spaces are available daily in P1. Exchange your P1 parking ticket for a validated parking pass at the media centre but please note parking is available on a first-in basis.

AROUND SYDNEY SHOWGROUND

Please be considerate of competition judging and pay careful attention to animals and exhibitors when filming, photographing or conducting interviews.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

The best way to get to and from the Sydney Royal Easter Show in Sydney Olympic Park is by public transport. With plenty of extra trains and Sydney Olympic Park Major Event Buses running regularly throughout the Show it's easy to get there and back by public transport.

PARKING

Parking at Sydney Olympic Park will be in high demand during the Sydney Royal Easter Show and car parks are likely to reach capacity. You can guarantee a space and save on the daily rate by pre-booking your parking ticket. Pre-booked parking through Sydney Olympic Park is \$20 for the whole day.

IMPORTANT TICKET INFORMATION

Show tickets are not available for purchase at Sydney Trains and NSW TrainLink stations or on-board Sydney Olympic Park Major Event Buses or any other transport service. Show tickets are only available online via Ticketmaster.

There are no exchanges, refunds or cancellations on purchased Show tickets. If the 2022 Sydney Royal Easter Show is cancelled, a full-refund policy will apply.

SHUTTLE BUS AND TAXIS

Shuttle buses will run between the northern bus terminal (plaza Show entry) and the P5 car park, and between the Dawn Fraser bus terminal and the P3 and P4 car park. All Showgoers travel for free. Service operates from 9.00am – 11.00pm.

TAXIS

Taxis are available on Herb Elliot Ave (near Australia Ave) until 5pm and then on Murray Rose Ave (near the Carnival gate) from 5pm - 11pm.

- EarlyBird (Up to 7 April): Adult \$39, Child \$23.50, Concession \$29, Family of 4 \$99.50
- 8-19 April: Purchase online for Adult \$41, Child \$25.50 and Concession \$31.
- Twilight tickets: visit the Show after work/school and save. Child Twilight tickets are just \$12 for entry after 4pm, Adult \$33, Concession \$24.
- A \$4 booking fee applies when purchasing online.
- A limited number of tickets may be available for purchase at the gate, however this is not guaranteed.
- Kids' Day: Children get in for less than half price (\$12) on 19 April.
- Seniors' Day: Seniors save on 13 April - pre-purchase Seniors' Day tickets for \$17.50
- Entry is free for children aged three years and under.

CARNIVAL FUN PASS

The Sydney Royal Easter Show carnival is excited to move away from the traditional paper coupons for carnival rides and games to the easy-to-use Carnival Fun Pass. Once the Pass is loaded with credits you simply Tap & Ride and Tap & Play across the carnival, just like your NSW Opal card.

A Carnival Fun Pass can be ordered when you purchase your Show Tickets from Ticketmaster. One pass per family will be provided for free – additional can be purchased for \$4 each. Your card will be posted out to you so you can load credits in advance, allowing you to head straight to the carnival as soon as you get to the Show.

The early bird carnival ticket offer is available until 07 April and could save you up to 27%. Two packages are available:

- 140 credits \$113 (save \$41)
- 115 credits \$100 (save \$26.50)

The Carnival Fun Pass can be topped up via the official Sydney Royal Easter Show app, or at specially marked kiosks in the carnival areas at the Show. Passes may also be purchased from these kiosks for \$4 or are included for free when you purchase a coupon package.

GIVING BACK

The Royal Agricultural Society of NSW Foundation (RASF) was created in 2007 with a mission to support the development of sustainable and resilient regional and rural communities across New South Wales by promoting individual and community growth via educational scholarships and community grants.

The RASF Community Futures Grant Program assists with funding and supporting small, locally-focused projects, that have the potential to provide long-term social or economic benefits to regional communities in NSW. Previous projects range from rebuilding areas of showgrounds impacted by bushfires to local education workshops and social programs that give back to the community.

The RASF is assisted by the sale of the Ag Bag at the Sydney Royal Easter Show, with every cent raised from the sales going directly to the RAS Foundation Community Futures Grant program.

First launched at the Show in 2014, the Ag Bag has been a sell-out success every year since. Celebrating Australian produce and proudly sponsored by SunRice, the Ag Bag is jam-packed with product donations from generous Australian owned and made products including Manildra's Healthy Baker Flour and Kurrajong Kitchen's Lavosh.

With more than 50,000 items packed into 2,500 Ag Bags onsite at Sydney Showground by volunteers and RAS staff, the bag serves as a brilliant reminder of what we can achieve when we come together for a great cause.

Donating organisations see it as a terrific way to celebrate Australian agriculture and farming whilst helping generate funds for rural community projects. Participants appreciate the exposure of their brand and product and the opportunity to support a grass-roots initiative. This year, proceeds from the sale of the AG Bag will go towards projects in Cooma, Ungarie, Wagga Wagga, Bellingen, Grenfell, Hay, Crookwell, Tullamore and Inverell.

The Ag Bag stand at the 2022 Sydney Royal Easter Show is in the Home & Lifestyle Pavilion. With over \$70 worth of product included this year, the Ag Bags are available for just \$25 each until sold out.

COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS

Sydney Royal Easter Show competitions are run by the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW to measure and maintain excellence in agriculture. The competitions are judged by experts in their fields to ensure only the 'best of the best' are awarded a prestigious Sydney Royal ribbon.

ALPACA COMPETITION

In 1869 Alpacas were first judged at the Show - in the sheep competition! In 1870 their fleece was judged in the wool section, in 1882 they were judged in the dog section, but at last in 1992 alpacas were placed in their own competition and have been showing strongly and growing in popularity ever since. Alpacas are assessed on their bone structure, proportion and their balance, whilst their fleece is judged on density, lustre and character. Alpaca fleece is quite luxurious and silky, making the softest of baby blankets, lightweight shawls and classic cardigans and coats.

ARTS & CRAFTS

A competition dating back to 1888, the Sydney Royal Arts & Crafts Show welcomes over 4000 exhibits in art, photography, pottery, sculpture, preserves, woodwork, cake decorating, quilting, soft toys and another 300 categories. Recognised as the largest arts & crafts competition in Australia it's hard to believe it all started with preserved fruit entries 134 years ago. This year a highlight is the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW 200 Year Celebration Novelty Cake Class and the new Perishable Cooking for Novices and Baklava class.

AVIARY BIRDS

In 1869 aviary birds were entered in the poultry competition, and from 1907-1985 they had a strong showing in the poultry, pigeons, canaries and cage birds competition. In 1998 they stood alone in the Cage Birds competition, which was renamed the Aviary Birds competition in 2017. With that much history it makes sense our feathered friends may be a small species, but their competition is a large one. Sponsored by Trill, African lovebirds, budgerigars, canaries, finches and parrots are judged by specialists from breed clubs assessing head and neck type, colour and weight.

BABY PUPPY COMPETITION

Cuteness overload! At just 3 - 6 months old these little guys frolic more than flaunt their way around the ring. Every afternoon, you will be treated to an absolutely adorable display as Best Baby Puppy of the day is awarded their trophy.

CANINE HERO AWARDS

Every year, among our tail-wagging friends, heroes emerge with unique stories. At the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW Canine Hero Awards these deserving dogs are rewarded and acknowledged in two categories; AAR Service Dog Award and the AAR Companion Dog Award. Whether they have shown incredible bravery or transformed a life in adversity, the common factor is these remarkable animals and their human companions have enriched lives.

CAT COMPETITION

In 1870 cats were shown as an extra exhibit in the poultry competition but in 1929 they were given their own competition and they have been the cream of the crop ever since. The ADVANCE™ Sydney Royal Cat Show is recognised as one of the most prestigious competitions in the world for fancy felines.

CATTLE BEEF

The Elders Sydney Royal Beef Cattle Show begins on Day 1 of the Show with the Beef Cattle judging and Steer Competitions. More than 20 breeds will compete in various categories, with the most prestigious awards announced from 1.00pm on Monday 11 April:

Urquhart Trophy: awarded to the Supreme Beef Exhibit from both Grand Champion Males and Females in all beef breeds,

RAS Supreme Interbreed Heifer: awarded to the Supreme Heifer (under 20 months),

Hordern Trophy: awarded to the best pair consisting of the Grand Champion Male and Female of each breed.

Feature breed is the Simmental, in conjunction with the Australian 50th Anniversary celebrations for the Simmental Society.

CATTLE DAIRY

A full and strong udder is a must, the judges are looking for cows that can really display lots of milk. They like to see nice legs and feet that can walk long distances. But they also want well-attached udders and nice feet placement.

CAVY

Most people know them as guinea pigs, but to breeders and enthusiasts they are a cavy and make fascinating and low-maintenance pets, quite often regarded as a member of the family. This competition, held by the NSW Cavy Club, promises to deliver cuteness and curiosity at a whole new level.

DOG COMPETITION

Man's best friend has been a friend of the Show dating back to 1824, but their first standalone competition began in 1869 and along the way has included alpacas in 1882 and even dog biscuits in 1901. In 1931 the first Dog Best in Show was awarded, and it has been a highly coveted ribbon ever since. Along with the customary competitions, including agility, breed, and junior handler classes this year to mark the bicentenary of the RAS a Periodic Class has been introduced. Open to breeds that were owned when the Sydney Royal Dog Shows first started, traditional breeds including Greyhounds, Skye Terriers, Retrievers, St Bernards, Bulldogs, Pointers, Bloodhounds, Sheepdogs and Beagles will be represented. This year is also a celebration of our devoted four-legged friends, with a special Pet/Companion class introduced. Don't worry about purebreds and fancy bloodlines, this class recognises the amazing bond we share with our pets and will award Best Female, Best Male and the Best Exhibitor/Dog Lookalike.

FLOWER & GARDEN COMPETITION

Until 2007 this competition was known as Horticulture - a competition that has been held at the Show every year since 1929. However, 1929 wasn't the first appearance of gatherings from the garden, in 1869

silkworms were judged along with sugar cane and tobacco in 1871, and even salads in 1875. In 1929 the competition became one predominantly of 'flowering and other plants' although fish and aquariums were entered in 1957-1959. Today the competition looks at cut flowers, cacti & succulents, fruit and vegetables with four special classes in flower arranging this year – Period Design (heritage), Traditional Design, European Design, and Contemporary Design. The Judges are looking for perfect blooms, well-kept and tidy plants, and creative arrangements.

FROGS & REPTILES

Established in 2011 this is now one of the biggest frog and reptile competitions in Australia as well as one of the most popular amongst all Show visitors. Non-venomous snakes, lizards and a range of frogs are judged on appearance and breed standard, so they are certainly not your common garden variety lizards!

Although the competition is held on two days only – 18 & 19 April, Australian Wildlife Displays will be hosting talks and displays every day of the Show inside the Pet Pavilion.

GOAT COMPETITION

Attracting over 1000 entries every year, this is the Goat Show that butts all others out of the way. Dairy, Boer, Angora and Mohair fleece are judged across 12 days in their individual breed classes. Judges are looking at trueness to type and breed along with strong breeding lines or strong yield ability in all classes, but when the goats aren't in the judging ring they are on display and ready to see you – goats

have rectangular pupils, giving them vision for 320-340 degrees (humans have 160-210 degrees). For the first time the tiniest members of the bovid family will enter the ring for assessment by our judges. Mini Goats are cooperative and curious, incredibly interactive and surprisingly brave... don't miss them.

HONEY COMPETITION

Although honey has been enjoyed as far back as Ancient Egyptian times, the first honeybees came to Australia 200 years ago and have been giving us the nectar of the gods ever since. Perhaps it is the abundance of flowers and natural goodness we have here, but we believe Australian honey is the world's best and our Sydney Royal Judges agree. But they don't stop at honey, this national competition also assesses mead, candles, wax molds, pollen and beeswax too. The winning entries are on display every day.

HORSE COMPETITION

Horse competitions and events have been a part of our Shows since the first one in 1823 when a prize was awarded for best colonial-bred stallion. Over the next 198 years the competition grew in classes, size and prestige and is recognised as one of the largest in Australia.

The beauty and spectacle of horses in competition is a sight not to be missed – every day of the Show you can see the magnificent equines judged on presentation, movement, manners whilst the riders are assessed on position, presentation and effectiveness of aids.

Highlights of the Sydney Royal Horse Show include the Col A V Pope Best Gelding Hack over 15hh and the F L Crane Best Mare or Filly Hack over 15hh, along with the Champion Multiple Turnout featuring Heavy Horses and heritage horse drawn vehicles. The Evening Harness Parade is a must-see, as is the RM Williams Pointscore and Working Stock Horses competition.

PIG COMPETITION

First held at the Show in 1824, with Berkshires the common breed, the Sydney Royal Pig Show is returning to these roots to mark our bicentenary with Berkshires appearing as the 2022 feature breed. These magnificent heritage breed pigs are black with a splash of white on the snout, legs and tip of the tail, and weigh up to 280 kgs as an adult. Every year the Sydney Royal Pig Show is made up of the best display of pure breed stud pigs in Australia, including Tamworth, Large White, Hampshire, Duroc and the Wessex Saddleback - all competing for the prestigious title of Best Pig in Show.

POULTRY & PIGEON COMPETITION

Chickens, pigeons, ducks, turkeys, geese and even guinea fowl make up the 2500 exhibits in this competition - one that has grown steadily since first taking place in 1858. The judges are not just looking for the finest feathers, they have their eyes firmly focussed on carriage, size,

markings, tail, head and legs and compare the bird to the Standard of Perfection for that breed. Pigeons, including racing pigeons will be judged on 15 April only.

Judged to the Australian Poultry Standard, eggs are assessed on shape, size, shell colour and quality before the judges crack them open and assess egg freshness, internal colour and the height of both yolk and white. The perfect egg has a shell that is smooth all over, with a nicely rounded golden yellow yolk.

The feature breeds are the Orpington and the Australorp.

RABBITS

In 1858 rabbits were judged in the poultry competition, which makes perfect sense... one has fur and one has feathers, one hops and one has wings... but both do make excellent pets! In 1882 the farmers of NSW decided rabbits were becoming a bit of a pest, so they stopped the competition, but in 1997 they came back and have been leaping into the hearts of Showgoers ever since. Run by the Rabbit Fanciers Society of NSW, the Sydney Royal Rabbit Show includes Fancy, Fur, Rex and Lop classes with each bunny judged on colour, patterns and fur, coat condition, ears, eyes and tails.

At the conclusion of the final round of the Wrangler Federation Rodeo Challenge on 19 April, a presentation will take place rewarding the Champions in each discipline - Bull Ride, Bareback, Saddle Bronc and Steer Wrestling.

SHEEP COMPETITION

The Sydney Royal Sheep Show, running across all 12 days of the Show, consists of Merino, Fleece, and Meat & Dual Purpose Breeds Competitions.

Merino - The history of this magnificent breed dates back to the first Show held by the RAS in 1823, when an award was presented for Best Australian Merino. Today, the Grand Champion Rams and Grand Champion Ewes in the Sydney Royal Sheep Show compete for the coveted title of Supreme Merino.

Fleece - Recognised around the world as the most luxurious natural fibre available, Australian Merino wool is judged on one day only at the Sydney Royal Sheep Show with weight, uniformity of length and colour closely examined.

Meat & Dual Purpose - The Meat & Dual Purpose Breeds is a collective of 13 breeds of sheep exhibiting at the Show. These are well-rounded breeds of sheep, valued for their ability to produce high quality fleece whilst also possessing the size and growth important for meat production.

YOUNG AUCTIONEERS COMPETITION

Auctions and agriculture have gone together in Australia since the days of early settlement. In 1843 Thomas Mort persuaded NSW pastoralists to sell their wool by auction here rather than ship it to England to be sold. By the late 1840s he was also running auctions of livestock and pastoral property. Fittingly, Mort was Vice-President of the RAS from 1861-1878 and the relationship with auctions continues... The Australian Livestock & Property Agents (ALPA) Young Auctioneers Competition with the State and then National Finals take place in front of a full audience. Not only a competition to see who has the gift of the gab, it is a live auction with each competitor selling prize winning Sydney Royal Purebred Steers and aiming to get the best price for vendors.

A Vice-Regal tradition dating back well over a hundred years, the Official Opening of the Sydney Royal Easter Show will be performed Her Royal Highness, Princess Anne, the Princess Royal. The participation of the Australian Defence Force, including Australia's Federation Guard and the defence band, adds prestige to the historical occasion. Princess Anne will be escorted by the NSW Mounted Police as she makes her way into the stadium in a horse-drawn caleche originally built more than 150 years ago. The first time it was used it carried Her Majesty the Queen, Prince Phillip, Prince Charles and Princess Anne to the Main Arena where they officially opened the 1970 Show.

KIDS DAY 19 APRIL

Today is the last day of the Sydney Royal Easter Show, which means it's Kids' Day! There are loads of great deals and attractions to thrill and amaze younger Showgoers. Children can come to the Show for just \$12 today and enjoy two for one rides up until 5pm (offer excludes Kyle & Jackie O's Haunted House and Sling Shot). Entry for children three and under is FREE!

Kids day at the show can be traced back to 1870 when the exhibition committee met during the show and declared that a Children's Day be appointed, and the programmes be amended accordingly. The concept was not scheduled for the following year until the second last day of the Exhibition, when it was announced to 'reduce the price of admission for children tomorrow', thus beginning a last day of show tradition.

CHILDREN'S DAY HISTORY

The 1870s were the start of many traditions for the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW that continue to this day, including two that involve some of our youngest attendees.

On Tuesday 2nd August 1870 we can see the origins of Primary Preview Day, when the Exhibition Committee decreed that "a day be set apart in the third week of the Exhibition for the purpose of enabling all school children to visit the Exhibition". The day was advertised in advance by the Society, and the Launceston Examiner reported that "The school children, to the number of 10,000, were entertained at the Exhibition."

Kids' Day also first occurred in 1870, but its appearance seems to have been a much less organised affair. The Exhibition for 1870 ran from 30th August to the 30th September, but on the 7th September 1870 the minutes show that the Exhibition Committee met and declared that for a Children's Day "Friday 16th be appointed and that the programmes submitted be adopted as amended". The reason for the lateness of the introduction of Children's Day is unknown, but it seems by 1871 the Exhibition Committee was still getting used to the idea as on Friday 25th August, the second last day of the Exhibition, they declared "to reduce the price of admission for children tomorrow".

2022 FEATURE BREEDS

POULTRY SECTION

This year the Poultry Show has two feature breeds – the Orpington and the Australorp. The Orpington was one of the first breeds of poultry introduced to Australia and although it is traditionally a table (or meat) bird they do have egg laying capacity. However, in order to improve the egg laying they were crossed with other breeds and the Australorp was born – this Australian Orpington was one of the first breeds developed on Australian soil. Not only are they a top layer and a perfect backyard chicken, they are friendly and ideal for children interested in a poultry pet.

SHEEP SECTION

The 2022 feature breed for Sheep – Meat & Dual Purpose, is the Australian White. Australian White were bred specifically for conditions in Australia. They are large, low maintenance and exceptionally hardy, and were first shown at the Sydney Royal Sheep Show in 2011.

The feature breed for Merinos this year is Super Fine – a luxurious soft fleece that is extremely warm yet silky soft on the skin.

BEEF CATTLE

In conjunction with the Australian 50th Anniversary celebrations for the Simmental Society, the Feature Breed at the 2022 Sydney Royal Cattle Show is the Simmental. Originally a Swiss breed ideal for beef and dairy, Simmentals were first imported to Australia in 1972. Simmentals have a quiet temperament and number about 70,000 in Australia.

ABOUT OUR COVER

Show posters have often been the centrepiece of Easter Show publicity – an advertising blitz plastered around railway stations, on ferries and trams, even on the sides of postal vans in the 1930s and 40s. These were the good old days; commuters were on the move and everywhere they looked they were invited to the Show.

The posters were artworks, often commissioned and designed by leading commercial artists and graphic designers, and now held safely in galleries and heritage collections. They told a story using iconic Show images, the fun of the Show, the country coming to town, competitions and carnival rides, and of course animals – the star of the poster was quite often a horse, with cattle and sheep getting into the picture whenever they could.

Last year the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW ran a poster competition calling on today's designers to capture the history and fun of a day at the Show. Artwork by six incredibly talented finalists was on display at the 2021 Sydney Royal Easter Show and the public was encouraged to vote for their favourite. The cover of this Guide features the winning poster – designed by Jayniel Villacorta.

Jayniel (Jaii) Villacorta is a local multidisciplinary artist with a strong focus on illustration. She is a self-taught illustrator with a background in graphic design and a passion for sustainability and ethical practices. Jaii's design celebrating the bicentenary of the RAS features abundance and growth – her inspiration for the artwork.
